Good Luck to Mrs. Maver, wo will sadly be leaving Lincoln School for a new professional opportunity for her. Mrs. Thompson will continue in grade 2 for the remainder of the year. Best wishes to Dr. Kuder - Farewell was held at EMS on Monday, 12/17 - Dr. Kuder attended schoolwide morning meeting on Wednesday, 12/19. Welcome to Mr. Jeff Feiffer, who will serving as the new interim Superintendent through June. Mr. Feiffer has been a terrific addition to the Wyckoff team, and has already worked closely with the principals and central office staff to ensure continuity of administration. He has decades of experience in Bergen County as a principal and Superintendent. Lincoln School recently installed a new "swipe card entrance" outside the 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> grade wing. This will improve efficiency and security, and is a welcomed building improvement. Looking forward to our "5th Grade Flapjack Fundraiser" on Monday 1/21. Please be sure to see the Friday Folder with information on the "Wyckoff Connected Parent Series." There are some great learning opportunities for parents throughout the remainder of the school year. Staff has continued to work on several instructional initiatives. A number of teacher teams are engaging in Self-Directed

Growth Plans, which are essentially action projects focusing on specific areas of inquiry and instruction. These include problem-based learning in math, interactive math software programs, "Breakout EDU" lessons to build flexible thinking and several others. We have also continued our work on the book "The Curious Classroom," which we are reading as a staff book club. Our latest chapter looked at the importance of building both "acquaintance" and "identity" to build a positive classroom climate—helping students get to know themselves and their classmates as learners. This fits nicely with our work in Responsive Classroom as well as in Cultural Competency. Several statewide changes to our assessment system. There remains Language Arts and Math testing in Grades 3-5, and Science testing in Grade 5. This is re-branded from PARCC to NJ Student Learning Assessment, with some changes in timing. The format of the assessment will remain essentially unchanged.
